

STUDY 9 KNOWLEDGE

In order for us to grow as Christians, we need to gain knowledge—about God, about His Word, about His plan for us. Knowledge means apprehending truth; knowing something with familiarity gained through experience or association.

Let's begin this study by memorizing Psalm 147:5:

"Great is our Lord, and mighty in power; His understanding is infinite."

The Bible tells us that God is omniscient. The word omniscient means that God knows all things and is absolutely perfect in knowledge.
